Fritz learned the craft of the guerrilla under such masters as Botha, De la Rey and Smuts, and from Smuts he learned, too, in due course the arts of peace, for it was Smuts who persuaded Reitz to return to South Africa and help in building the young Dominion. In that capacity Reitz showed the same qualities of wisdom, courage and leadership which he had developed as a fighting man, and he crowned a brilliant career of public service to the Union of South Africa by becoming its High Commissioner in London. He has related these

chapters of his life in such later books as 'Trekking On' and 'No Outspan'-but 'Commando', written in his early twenties, remains his master-piece and has won its place as a classic of adventure.




