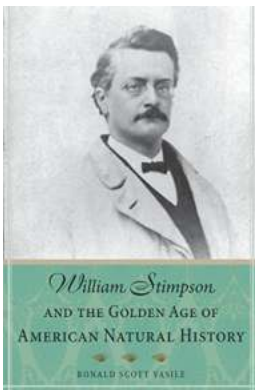

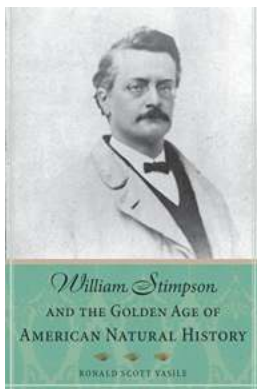

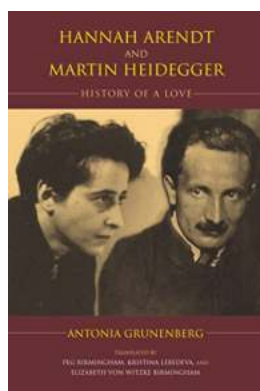
William Stimpson was at the forefront of the American natural history community in the latter half of the nineteenth century.
