

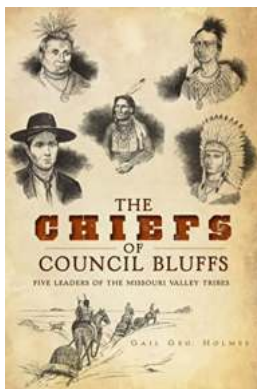
Five Leaders of the Missouri Valley Tribes

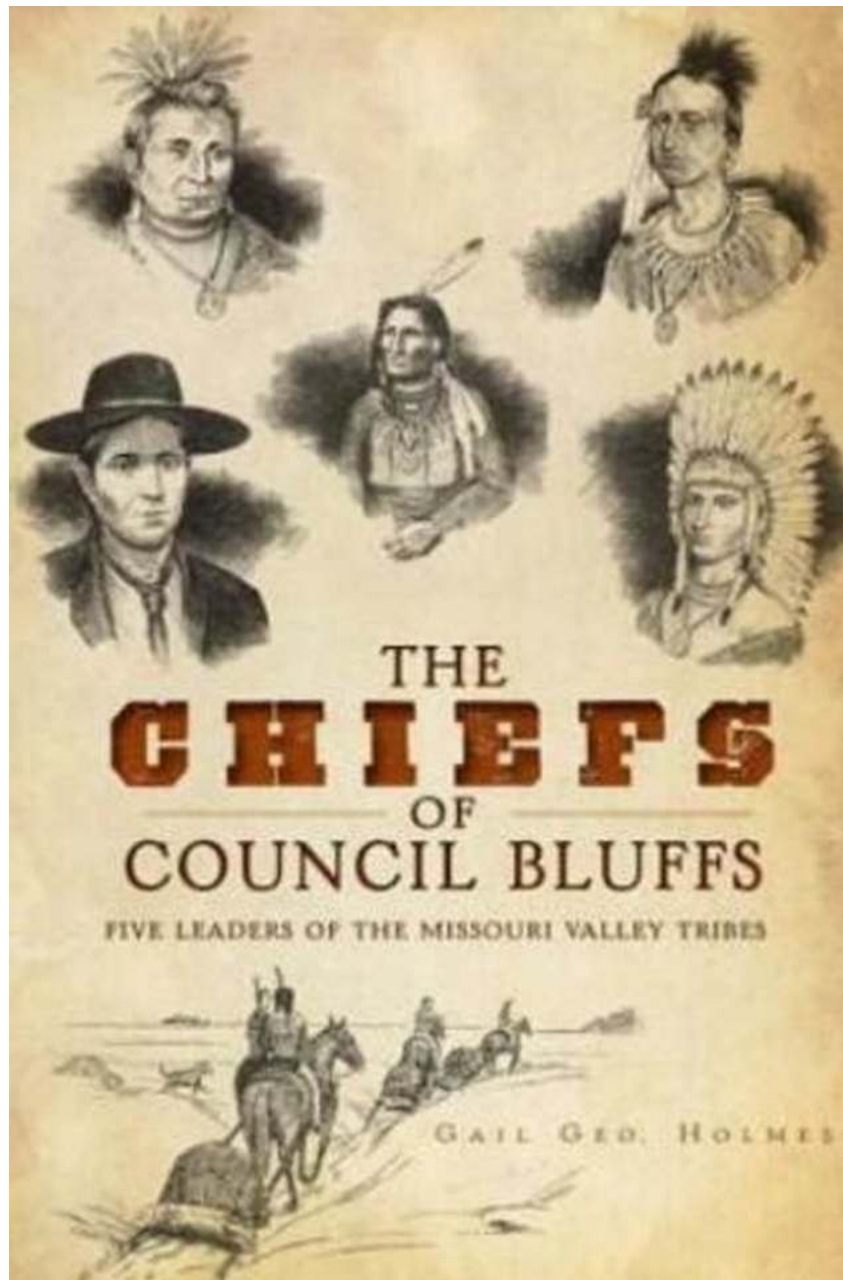

5. Chief Rain-in-the-Face

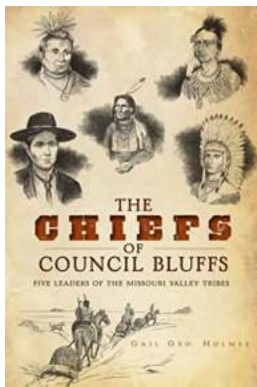
