Timely and engaging, *The Tolls of Uncertainty* posits that a new path must be taken if the nation's unemployed are to find real relief.



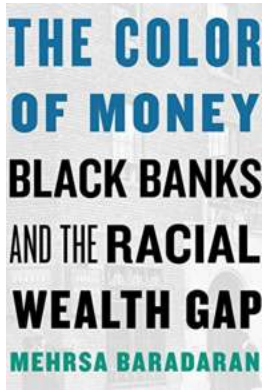

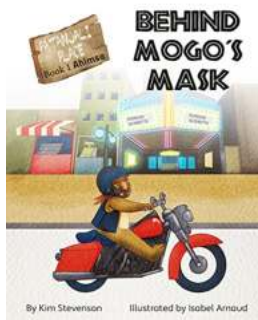

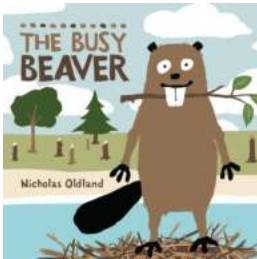
