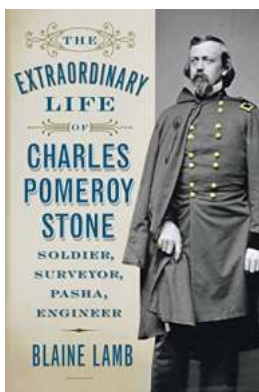

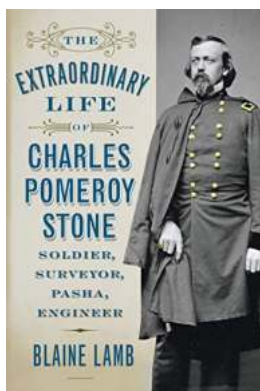

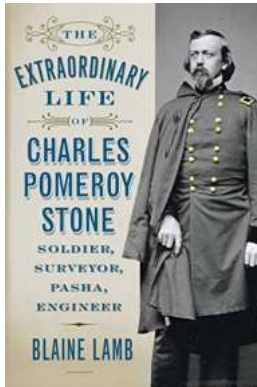
Civil War Hero and Scapegoat, Surveyor of Mexico, General of the Egyptian Army, and Builder of the Statue of Liberty's Pedestal

In the winter of 1861, as the secession crisis came to a head, an obscure military engineer, Charles Pomeroy Stone, emerged as the rallying point for the defense of Washington, D.C. against rebel attack. Stone, a Democrat who did not see the conflict as a crusade against slavery, and who lost his only battle, failed on all counts.

Readers of Civil War history know Stone best for his mistreatment at the hands of the Joint Committee. When his name appears, it is almost always in connection with the battle at Ball's Bluff, Virginia, during which a close associate of Lincoln's was killed, and its aftermath. His story, however, goes far beyond that engagement. In *The Extraordinary Life of Charles Pomeroy Stone: Soldier, Surveyor, Pasha, Engineer* that ranges from the Halls of Montezuma to Gold Rush California, and from the pyramids of Egypt to the foot of the Statue of Liberty, historian Blaine Lamb brings to light the many facets of Stone's remarkable life and career. adventure, exploration, war, and intrigue remains Stone himself, a man of honor, steadfast loyalty, and tragic innocence.



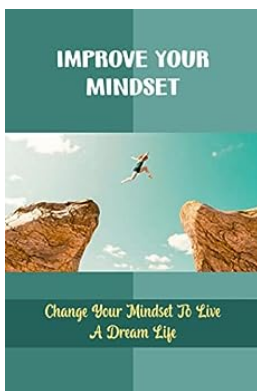

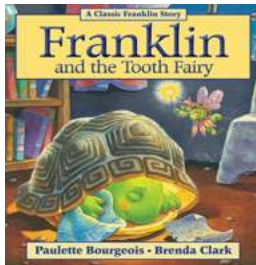

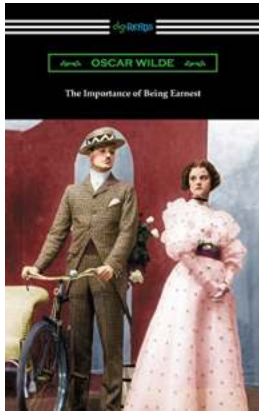
