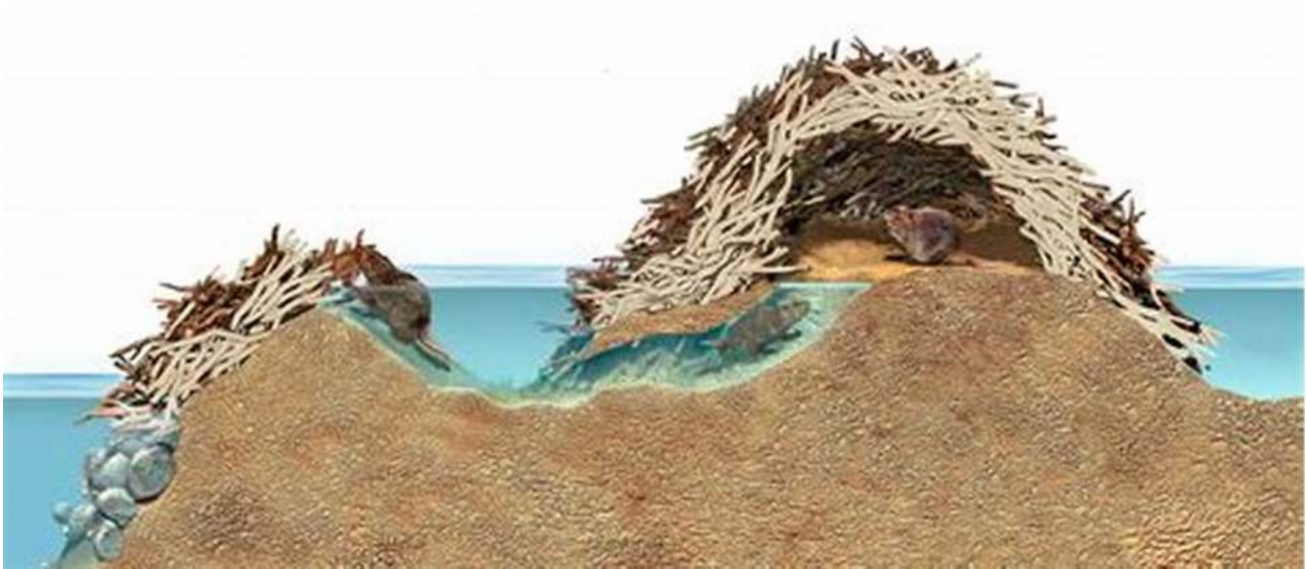

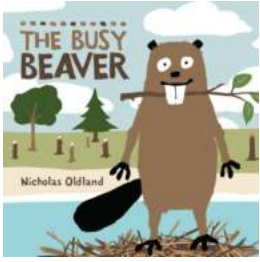

- The two keystone species we will be identifying later are salmon and wolves native to the PNW.



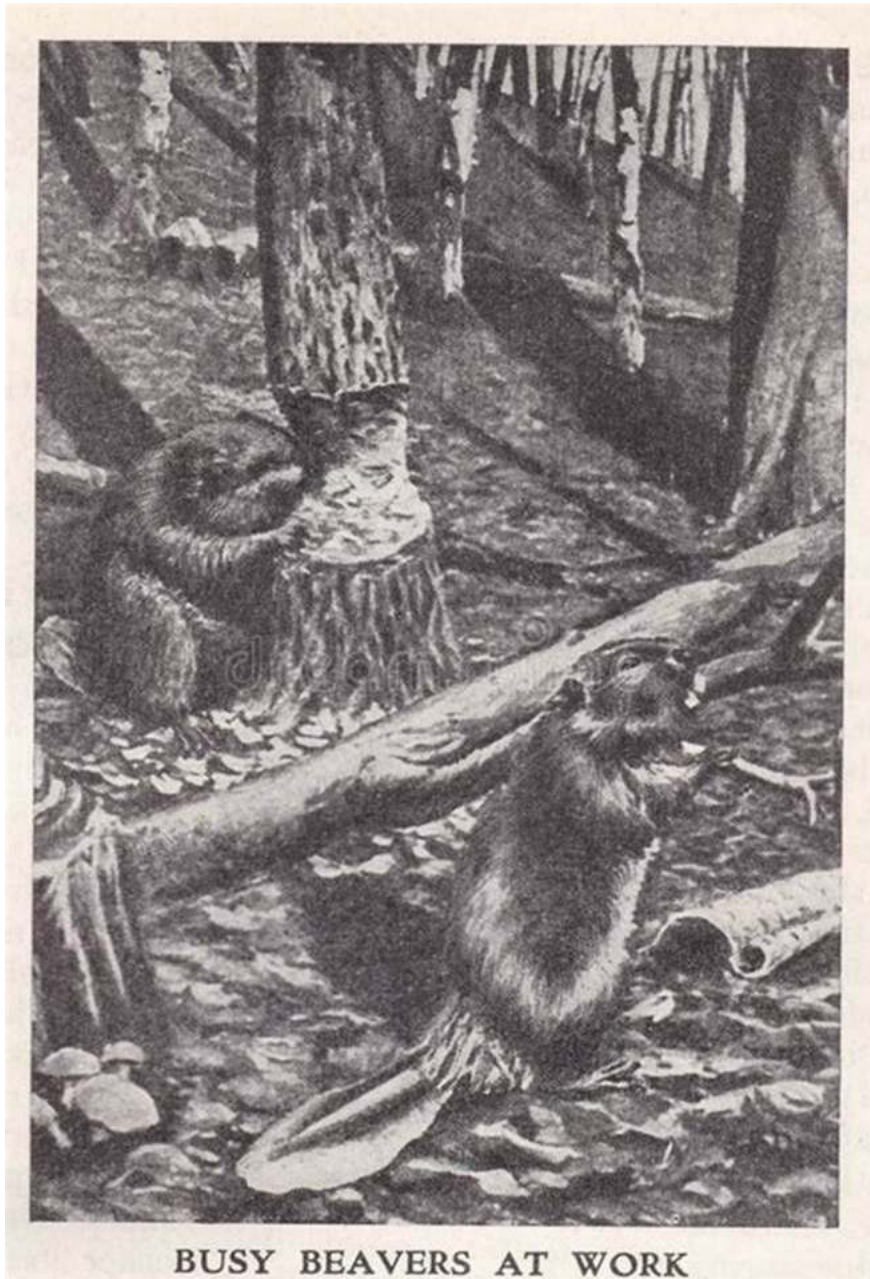
