

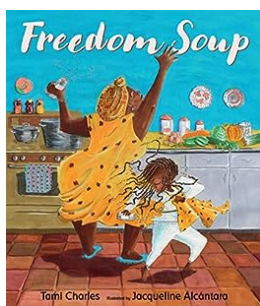

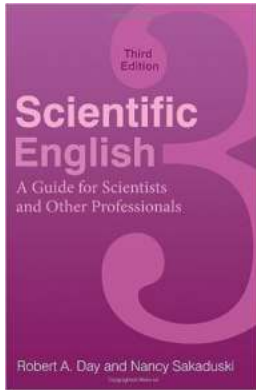
The shake-shake of maracas vibrates down to my toes. Ti Gran’s feet tap-tap to the rhythm.

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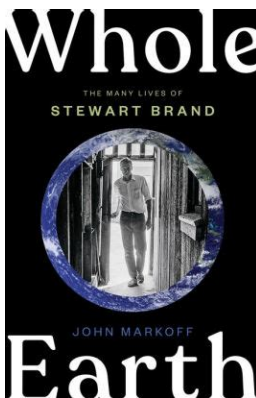
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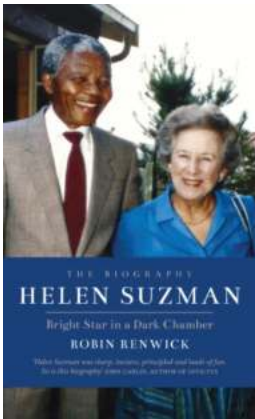
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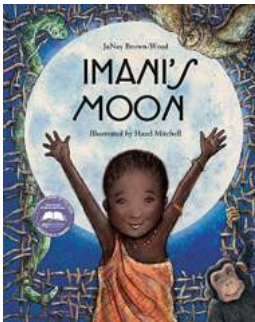
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
