

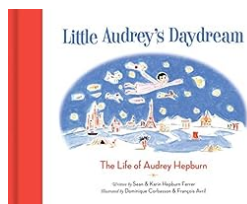
The Enigmatic Life of Audrey Hepburn - A True Icon
