



Marie Stopes (1880–1958), the controversial but brilliant British palaeobotanist, arrived in Japan in 1907 to stay for almost three years on a scholarship from the Royal Society to do research into fossils. Drawn to the country by her passion for a Japanese scholar she had met in Germany, she soon found their relationship had cooled, yet her love for the country only deepens.

When not in Tokyo mingling with intellectuals or doing research, she ventured out into the countryside, to look for a special species of cycad, to visit a famous temple, or to simply enjoy a quiet spot along the as yet unspoiled coast of the Boso or Miura Peninsulas.

Invariably inquisitive in her pursuit of science, (almost) always positive in her outlook on Japanese customs and culture, and always eager to share her most personal yet informed opinions, Marie Stopes still captivates the modern reader with her wit, curiosity, and sheer intelligence. 




